WWLL 2023 Golf Tournament

Scramble Format

- 1. Each golfer on the team hits a drive. Red tees will be used by all.
- 2. The results of the drives are compared. Which one is best? That ball is selected and marked, and the other golfers on the team pick up their golf balls and move them to that location.
- 3. The second <u>strokes</u> are played, and the process repeats: Select the best ball, move the other balls to that spot and play the third strokes.
- 4. And so on, until the ball is holed for one team score.
- 5. Combined handicaps for a two person team will be used.

<u>Please record your team names and your scores clearly ...and please post your card in the club house immediately after play many thanks.</u>

There are 2 Scramble prizes.

One for the front 9 holes and another for the back 9 holes.

It is important to note that if your assigned starting hole is on the back nine be sure to stay on the back nine. i.e. if you start off on #16 when you complete #18 you move to #10 and your finishing hole is #15. Similarly if your assigned starting hole is #3 when you complete #9 our next hole is #1. and your finishing hole is then #2.

Club staff will be on hand to direct activities if there are any questions.

Scramble Rules

- 1. When moving golf balls to the spot of the selected shot, the other golfers on the team can play from within one-club length of the original spot. But that one-club length cannot be closer to the hole, and it can't improve the <u>lie</u> of the original ball. That is, if the selected drive is in the first cut of <u>rough</u>, then the other members of the team cannot hit from the <u>fairway</u> even if the fairway is within one club-length. Likewise, you can't move a ball onto the putting green when the selected ball is in the fringe.
- 2. Order of play on every stroke is usually at the sole discretion of each scramble team. Just because Golfer X hit first off the tee doesn't mean Golfer X has to hit first on the second stroke, and so on. Likewise, your ball being selected as the best after a given stroke doesn't mean you have to hit first (or last) on the next stroke. It's up to the team to decide on order of play
